



Global Education Committee School of Education Course Seed Funding Call for Proposals 2018-2019

In support of the School of Education's Global Education Strategic Plan, the Dean's office will support the development of new courses, or the revision of existing courses, to make global education a more central component of departmental offerings. The Global Education Committee (GEC) will select up to 5 applications to receive \$2,000 each to support globally-focused course development.

GEC is particularly interested in supporting proposals that will benefit students in departments where the existing curriculum does not commonly feature a global perspective and/or where the proposed or revised course is required for program completion. Funds might be dedicated to the:

- Design courses with a global focus.
- Take an existing course and integrating a global focus throughout.
- Take an existing course and add units/modules with global focus.
- Development of new or revision of existing courses and/or programs in partnership with other international institutions.
- Design of programs/courses taught (via distance) collaboratively with faculty from international institutions.

GEC invites proposals from faculty and faculty associates in the School of Education that further the goal of global education within the SOE. The GEC will review a first round of applications at its December 2018 meeting, and will award funds on a first-come, first-served basis.

Funds can be used for student hourly support in developing the syllabus and/or learning materials, meeting with colleagues and/or experts in the development or revision of courses, purchasing resources and materials, and/or professional development on incorporating global perspectives in the course.

Proposals are encouraged to incorporate aims of the Global Education Strategic Plan which include diversity of perspectives, comparative approaches, local-global connections, transnational and Indigenous perspectives, cultural humility, and the inclusion of diverse experiences.

Proposals:

- Proposals should be brief, no more than 2 pages, and should specifically explain the proposed activities and how they will benefit multiple stakeholders and global education at UW-Madison.
- Proposals should identify how often the course will be regularly taught and expected enrollment.
- Proposals should include a budget detailing how funds requested would be spent.

Please Note: Funds must be expended and all receipts for reimbursement submitted by June 1, 2019.

In evaluating the merits of each proposal, the GEC will consider the following criteria:

- Potential contribution to diversification and the inclusion of a global perspective within core departmental programs.
- Availability of courses with a global focus in existing curriculum.
- Whether the course is required for a major/certificate/program, and the number of students in that program.
- The number of UW-Madison students, faculty, and academic staff who will benefit from the course.
- The extent to which a global focus is integrated throughout.

Submission of Proposals:

- Send proposals to the Global Education email account global@education.wisc.edu. This email account is monitored by the Global Education Coordinator and Associate Director.
- The first deadline is December 1, 2018. The proposals will be reviewed at the monthly GEC meeting.
