This course will provide an in depth review of data collection strategies that produce quantitative data for education research. Strategies reviewed include: surveys (phone, mail, in person), logs/diaries, and experience sampling method instruments. The course addresses these data collection strategies within the larger research process by examining how data collection relates to theory, measurement, analysis, and inference. Tradeoffs associated with each strategy will be addressed.
