

Social Studies Minor

The Social Studies minor described below is designed for students interested in becoming Middle Childhood/Early Adolescence (Grades 1-8) teachers with a specialty in social studies. This minor can be completed only by students admitted to the Middle Childhood/Early Adolescence options of the Elementary Education Program.

Complete **24 credits** to include the requirements of each group. A minimum 2.75 grade point average is required based on all UW–Madison course work included in the Social Studies minor. **The courses listed here will meet this requirement, but additional courses may be considered.** Confer with an advisor for consideration of additional courses.
