

2011-2012 University of Wisconsin-Madison Educator Preparation Data

2011-12 UW-Madison School of Education Highlights:

- Graduated 281 new educators.
- Endorsed 247 new educators for 272 Wisconsin initial educator licenses.
- 96%¹ of teacher-graduates who sought teaching positions were employed after graduation, 83% were employed in Wisconsin

Why is this data different from that presented in the Department of Public Instruction report card?

- Some graduates choose not to be endorsed for a Wisconsin license.
- Despite being endorsed for a Wisconsin license, some of graduates choose to not to apply for Wisconsin license.
- Some graduates take jobs in private schools inside and outside Wisconsin.
- Some graduates receive endorsement for multiple licenses.
